Case Study



A clients daughter was travelling through South America on her gap year. Prior to her departure she attended a Salamanca security awareness course. One of the elements of this course was to avoid routine and always be aware and suspicious. The client's daughter, Anna (pseudonym), then worked in Brazil whilst staying in a house with friends of her parents.

One Friday Anna was on her way home and as usual, she had taken a taxi. As it approached the street where she was staying, there was a broken down car blocking the road. She asked the taxi driver to drop her at the end of the street so that she could walk the last 100 metres home. She was just getting out of the taxi when Anna noticed that some of the street lights seemed to be broken and the driver and passengers of the car looked suspicious.

Something didn't feel right; she pressed the panic button on her personal alarm/ tracking device and got back into the taxi. The Salamanca monitoring centre were able to pin-point her location and listen in whilst she explained what had happened. They called the house and the local police with the registration number of the car. Soon a police siren was heard and the driver and passengers of the car fled. The police duly arrived and inspected the abandoned car - it was clear that the driver's door had been forced open and the car was stolen. The police believed it was going to be used as a part of a kidnap attempt. For Anna the training and technical support proved invaluable.

Case Study



A Salamanca client requested a review and security assessment of their recently purchased property. As independent consultants to the client, Salamanca reviewed the threat, risks and existing security and produced a series of recommendations. These recommendations were graded from basic level through to the Rolls Royce solution. They were presented in a modular form with an estimate of prices for each element. Salamanca were then able to discuss the merits of each recommendation and agree with the client on the appropriate technical solutions that they required. The client selected a combination of discreet (hidden in drain pipes) remotely monitored cameras, linked to the alarm system. This enabled them to have the system managed on their behalf, from setting and unsetting it via a phone call, through to remote diagnostics to check for faults. Salamanca wrote a tender document, issued it to potential suppliers, conducted site visits with suppliers, managed the tender process and, with the clients input, selected a supplier. Salamanca's initial estimate of costs was within 1% of the suppliers quotation. Salamanca then project managed the installation and tested it at completion prior to the client paying the contractor.
